



## BLANCHE L. REYMANN STATE SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Blanche L. Reymann was a West Virginia State Regent (1931-1933) and a founding member of the Wheeling Chapter. Following her death in 1964, her daughters Elizabeth Spillers, Paula Steger, and Nelda MacCorkle, made personal monetary contributions to establish a scholarship in her memory. In 1967, the WV State Society Daughters of the American Revolution adopted the scholarship, and the Blanche L. Reymann State Scholarship was established.

The scholarship has been awarded annually to a West Virginia female student in the top third of her class academically that qualifies for financial support. She must be entering her senior year in one of the private colleges or universities in the State of West Virginia:
