The following medals are presented through this committee in recognition of outstanding students, adults, and community groups and cadets in military education programs.

The DAR Distinguished Citizen Medal is presented to an individual 18 years of age or older or to groups that demonstrate honor, service, courage, leadership and patriotism. The chapter (or state) nominates the recipient on form ND-2004.

The DAR Youth Leadership Medal is presented to a boy or girl in grades 5-11* who fulfills the qualities of honor, service, courage, leadership and patriotism (Note for students in grade 12, consider the DAR Good Citizens Award). The medal may also be awarded to youth in organizations outside of school.

Cadet Medals The Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC), Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps (JROTC), and DAR Outstanding Cadet Medals are awarded to cadets in ROTC, JROTC or non-ROTC and police, fire and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) cadet programs.
