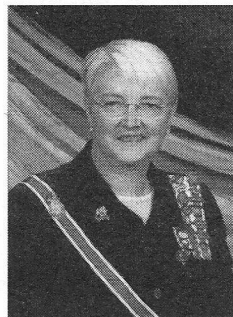

Faye is a third generation DAR member who joined as a Junior in 1974. She has two daughters who are DAR members and a granddaughter who is a DAR Junior member.

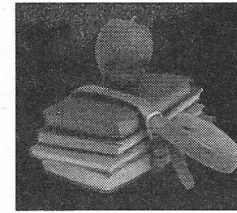

State Conference Fee

Each Chapter shall have paid dues for each member and must have paid the Chapter Conference dues (\$1.00 per member) for the current year. No chapter whose state dues and assessments, conference and district dues have not been paid shall be entitled to representation at the meeting of the State Conference.

Representation at Conference

Chapter representation is based on the number of members whose dues have been received by the State Treasurer and Treasurer General by December 1, 2008 not by the number of members in the chapter. Each Chapter shall be entitled to be represented at any meeting of the State Conference by three times as many delegates and alternates as at the previous Continental Congress (117th Continental Congress 2008) one of whom shall be the Regent, Vice Regent or Regent's representative. (State Chairmen and Vice Chairmen are appointees, and therefore have no vote at the 104th WV State Conference unless elected as delegates by their chapter).

Credentials

Credential cards/forms have been mailed to each chapter. One credential form must be completed and mailed to **Rebecca Davis, State Credentials Chairman, 1910 Lazzelle Union Blvd., Madsville, WV 26541-8017** and one to the State Regent as directed on the form, and must be postmarked by April 3, 2009. Each Chapter delegate must present with proper identification to the Credentials Desk the Chapter Delegate's official voting card completed and bearing the proper signatures to receive voter's ribbon and registration materials at the Registration Desk.

### Voting Body

The voting members of the State Conference or at any special meeting of the State Society shall be its Officers; Honorary Officers of the National Society whose membership is within the state; the Honorary State Regents of the West Virginia State Society; the Chapter Regents, or, in their absence, the First Vice Regent or alternate; the District Directors; and the delegates or their alternates from the Chapters of the State that are entitled to representation at the Continental Congress or special meetings of the National Society (Article VIII, Section 5).

### Reports

The State Officers, State Chairmen, District Directors and Chapter Regents shall prepare and submit a report for the State Conference of her work since the past State Conference (April 2008). Reports shall be typed, double-spaced on one side of 8 1/2 x 11" paper with 1.5 " left margin, ready for printing in the State Proceedings. Prepare three copies of your report, send one to the State Recording Secretary Kathleen Bledsoe, 1918 Bungalow Ave, Huntington, WV 25701-4212; one copy to the State Regent; and keep one copy for your file. Reports are to be mailed or sent electronically to the Recording Secretary and State Regent no later than March 25, 2009. Oral reports are limited to two minutes; Chapter Regents shall give a brief narrative of their **Chapter's** work; no awards or handouts will be permitted during the reporting. Only the Chapter Regent or First Vice Regent can give the Chapter Report. Reports will be filed if neither is present. Reports of State Officers, State Chairmen and Nominating Committee will be given during the Saturday morning Business Session; District Directors and Chapter Regents will report at the Saturday evening Banquet. Any reports not given during the Saturday Business Sessions will be given during Sunday morning Business Session.

### Awards

**CHAPTER PRESS BOOKS AND SCRAPBOOKS**

Chapter Press and Scrap Books to State Conference for display and judging are to be taken to the Side Lobby of the of the Holiday Inn on Friday, April 17, 2009. Chapters are responsible for picking up their Chapter books between 4 and 5 p.m. on Saturday, April 18, 2009.

**REQUIREMENTS FOR JUDGING**

Requirements for the Press Books are: clippings must be original, no photocopies; each item must include the name of the newspaper or publication and date of publication; do not write in the margin or underline names; chapter articles include those with content on chapter sponsored activities, such as CAR and DAR, on members where the chapter name appears in the article; DAR Magazine articles or ads initiated by chapters in which the chapter is named, state newspapers or bulletins, including church bulletins, using only the section where the chapter is named, with headings from the newspaper or bulletin; you may use obituaries of chapter members if DAR is mentioned in the write-up; include a typed page that describes the number of inches of type that your chapter received from April 1, 2008 to March 31, 2009; the first page should have the name of the chapter, the date and the name of the chapter regent; graphics are not necessary. Judging will be on the amount of inches of type, the amount of publicity given the chapter and accuracy of following the instructions. Judges will take into consideration duplication of articles and pictures, as well as the number of different chapter members in pictures.

Due to the difficulty for some chapter to get news coverage, we welcome chapters to bring in scrapbooks. Scrapbooks must have name of chapter, the date and name of the chapter regent on the first page; they can have original clippings from newspapers and other publications that include the chapter name or pictures of chapter activities; pictures of chapter meetings and activities should identify who and what; programs may be included; scrapbooks should contain materials from April 1, 2008 to March 31, 2009. Graphics may be used. Judging will be based on neatness, creativity and completeness of coverage of the chapter's activities for the year.

**CHINESE AUCTION**

We will have a "Chinese Auction" again this year at the 104th State Conference. It is not clear where the phrase "Chinese Auction" came from, but it is a widely popular form of fundraising that is simple and a lot of fun! A Chinese Auction is an event at which you bid for items with small double sided ticket that will be sold at the State Regent' Project table. Tickets will be sold for \$1.00 each or 6 for \$5.00. Bidders bid by placing a ticket or tickets into a container placed next to the item they wish to have. The winning ticket for each item will be drawn from that container at the Banquet on Saturday evening. We need lots of nice and unique items to entice people to buy tickets. Use your imagination selecting items to donate. Hopefully, we get lots of nice things and have a lot of fun. All proceeds will go toward areas where restricted funds cannot be used, such as a special event the state would be asked to take part in. 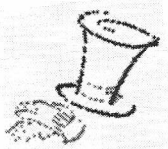

**Ms. Ettie Kette talks about State Conference**

We want our good manners and hospitality to be first-rate for our State Conference guests. We may also want to review our DAR protocol. These are a few reminders as we get ready for Martinsburg:



**Processional:** Everyone should be in the room and seated *before* the processional begins.  
Rise when the Flag of the United States of America enters the room. Face the Flag and salute it as it is carried in, hold the salute until the Flag is brought to a standstill. Remove glove on right hand – the left hand should be empty while saluting the Flag.  
Applaud when the President General or the State Regent enters the room and remain standing

**Saluting the flag:** Place the right hand over the heart when reciting the Pledge of Allegiance, and when singing the National Anthem. Remove glove from right hand before placing hand over the heart. The left hand should be empty (no purse, program, tissues, etc.)

Salute the flag when it is in motion: in processions, while being posted, etc.

**When the flag is at rest, you may drop the salute.**

**Business Session:** Members always stand upon the entrance and introduction of the State Regent and remain standing until she has reached her place on the platform or head table.

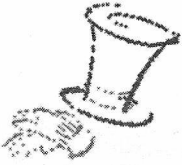
When giving a report, address *only* the chair: "Madam State Regent."

Chapter members stand briefly when their Chapter Regent or a State Officer from their Chapter gives her report. Members of a District also stand briefly when their District Director gives her report.

**DAR Breakfasts, Luncheons, and Banquets:** It is a courtesy to your table companions to wait until all have been served before beginning your own meal. Wait until the State Regent has picked up her fork.

**State Conference Guests:** The State Regent issues all invitations to her state conference, so that arrangements can be coordinated with the conference chairman. All correspondence must come from the State Regent.



We want our famous West Virginia hospitality to shine for our Conference guests. They have gone to some expense to travel to West Virginia – let us show them that we appreciate their effort by greeting them and chatting any time we see them standing alone. In fact, they should be accompanied at all times. Since we usually have a small number of pages, it is up to each of us to ensure that our guests are shown every courtesy while they are visiting us.

**Memorial Service:** Chapter members are to sit together by Districts at the Memorial Service on Sunday morning. Chapter members should stand when the names of deceased chapter members are read.
